


## **Details and Directions for the Annapolis Seminars**

Due to continued security measures at the USNA, parking on the Yard is limited to cars with Department of Defense parking stickers. Therefore, we suggest the following option for parking in Annapolis.

The closest parking garage outside the Academy is the Calvert Street Garage located at 19 St. John's Street. Parking at the Calvert Garage is FREE on the weekends. The other parking garages in Annapolis are not FREE. The walk to Mahan Hall is ½ mile using Gate 3, approximately 10 minutes. To get to the Calvert Street Garage from Route 50, take either Exit 24 or 24A, depending on your direction, to Rowe Blvd. Follow Rowe to Calvert Street, turn left, and enter the garage to your left. See map for walking directions on the following pages. Or watch for the electric carts. Small electric vehicles from Annapolis EvenTours will be running from the parking garage to USNA Gate 3. If you are staying at a local hotel, they may provide a shuttle to Gate 3, if requested. Gate 3 will be open for entry from 7-10 a.m. on Saturday only.

For those participating in pool sessions on Sunday, you should bring your own life jacket and foul weather gear, and you will need to enter at Gate 1 for mandatory security screening. The electric carts will run from the parking garage to Gate 1.

BE PREPARED: USNA Security will ask to see a government issued picture ID (drivers license or passport) upon entering Naval Academy grounds.

## **CHECKING IN**

## Everyone must register on site, as follows:

- Saturday Between 7:00-7:55 a.m. in Mahan Hall front lobby. All courses begin at 8:00 a.m.
- Sunday International Offshore and Hands-on Only participants will form up beginning at 7:45 a.m. at the Luce Hall south entrance (see map, you'll be directed inside). Course begins at 8:30 a.m. Safety for Cruising participants should meet in Lejeune Hall at 9:00 a.m. EVERYONE MUST REMEMBER TO KEEP THEIR WRISTBAND AND LUNCH TICKET.

The certificates earned for whichever course you enrolled are emailed DIRECTLY FROM US SAILING. Additionally, US Sailing keeps a 'Attendance Lookup' on their website.

## WHAT TO BRING

Dress appropriately for the weather and be prepared to walk. Parking is located outside the Academy, roughly 1/2 mile from Mahan Hall. In addition, everyone will walk to the on-water demonstrations on Saturday, an approximately 10-minute stroll. If you would like to take notes, please bring paper and pen.

If you are participating in the International Offshore, Hands-on Only, or the Safety for Cruising courses on Sunday, please bring the following: clothes or bathing suit to wear in the pool, a towel, waterproof plastic (trash) bag or provisions for taking home your wet gear. Also bring an inflatable or harness type PFD, foul weather gear, boots and a tether. This equipment is not mandatory however, it will allow you to review your personal gear and how it will assist or impair your safety. It is highly recommended to bring your own safety gear.

Boxed lunches will be provided both days. Due to the number of attendees, we have limited options. If you have special dietary requirements, you may want to plan ahead, accordingly.
